Red Ash Alphitonia excelsa



This spreading pioneer tree grows in many plant communities north from Narooma NSW around to the Kimberly WA. Attracts birds & butterflies.

Coogera Aryera divaricate



Drier coastal rainforests from Port Stephens NSW to northern QLD. Showy new foliage is salmon pink.

Tuckeroo *Cupaniopsis anacardioides*



An important canopy tree of littoral rainforests north of Bateman's Bay NSW to northern Australia. Tough and grows on poor coastal soils.

Hard Quandong Elaeocarpus obovatus



A common tree of coastal rainforests of NSW and QLD. Trunk is buttressed. Small blue fruits attract birds. Bitter fruit are edible but best cooked.

Blueberry Ash *Eleocarpus reticulatus*



Found on rainforest margins and on poor well-drained soils (not sand) on coast and ranges from Melbourne to SE QLD. Dark blue fruits

between May and October. The most flavoursome fruits are old & wrinkled. If the fruit is bright blue it can be eaten raw.

Red Olive Plum Elaeodendron australe



Tree of drier rainforests and Eucalypt forests of coastal and more inland NSW to SE QLD. Bright red-orange fruit – not edible. Leaves simple, opposite.

Ribbonwood Euroschinus falcata



A common, large, pioneer tree found where coastal rainforests meet Eucalypt forests in NSW north of Jervis Bay to QLD.

Grey Ironbark Eucalyptus paniculata



A common tree with hard, dark, furrowed bark found in central NSW coastal plains and hills.



Forest Red Gum Eucalyptus tereticornis



A common and very widespread tree from VIC (on coast and ranges) to

New Guinea. Usually has several almost vertical limbs.



Grey Gum Eucalyptus punctata



Grows of NSW coast and ranges. Grey bark is shed in patches

showing pink-orange inner bark. A favourite food for Koalas, it



grows on poor sandy soils as well as more fertile soils.

Strangler Fig or Small-leafed Fig Ficus obliqua



One of several species that slowly strangle their host tree. Coast and ranges from south NSW to north QLD, and nearby islands/ countries.

White Beech Gmelina leichhardtii



Deciduous tree of coastal rainforest -Illawarra NSW to central QLD. Now rare due to logging. The fruit, eaten by birds such as the Wompoo Fruit Dove, contains a hard wooden capsule.

Snow Wood Pararchidendron pruinosum



Found in many rainforests along the NSW coast, north to Indonesia. A legume, it adds nitrate to the soil. Unusual, colourful seed pods. Compound leaves.

Plum Pine *Podocarpus elatus*



A tree found in coastal rainforests of NSW and QLD. Belongs to a Gondwanaland 'Pine' family - Podocarpaceae. Unusual 2-part fruit – the edible, soft bit is the modified fleshy stem.

Common Lilly Pilly Syzigium smithii



East coast and ranges from VIC to NE QLD - found in rainforests and on riverbanks. Edible fruits of diverse colours.

Sandpaper Fig Ficus coronata



Found on riverbanks and gullies mostly in rainforests on coast and ranges and beyond from QLD to VIC. Leaves rough like sandpaper.

Port Jackson Fig Ficus rubiginosa



Found in both rainforests and eucalypt forests from Bega NSW to Cape York QLD. Also grows as a strangler fig. Leaf undersides are 'rusty' - aka Rusty Fig.

Brush Box Lophostemon confertus



Stunted trees on coastal headlands and huge trees in mountain valleys. Tolerant of pollution, pruning and drought. Widely planted.

Black Apple Planchonella australis



Found in rainforests of coast and nearby ranges Illawarra to SE QLD. Fruit large and edible. White sap when petiole broken. Leaves simple, alternate and lower

surface paler.

Celerywood Polyscias elegans



A pioneer rainforest species found on well-drained soil from Illawarra to Cape York on coast and nearby ranges. Unusual umbrella-shaped crown.

Leaves compound with a terminal leaflet.

Magenta Lilly Pilly Syzigium paniculatum



A bushy tree of rainforests in central coastal NSW. An endangered species. Edible fruit - not always magenta in colour.
